

JOHN XXIII COLLEGE NETBALL CLUB PRIMARY SCHOOL INFORMATION 2024

Welcome to Winter Netball 2024. We welcome all students whether new to the game or returning players from John XXIII College Primary School to the John XXIII College Netball Club.

There is a lot of information below, please read it all carefully.

Registration is completed online via PlayHQ, payment with credit card is required at that time. Registration is open from **1 Feb to 24 Feb 2024**. The registration fee covers registration, grading (if required), insurance, umpiring, specialist training, coaching, windup and equipment costs for the year. As the Club is run by parent volunteers there are no other costs passed on to players.

I urge you to register as soon as possible, once we reach the required number of players registration may be closed early.

Years 2, 3 & 4 – NetSetGo competition

The Years 2 & 3 will play "SET". The Year 4's will play "GO". These competitions use modified netball rules and as such the teams are not graded. Teams are made up of a mix of players to ensure that the girls enjoy their introduction into the sport. Games are played on Friday afternoons after school at Perth Netball Centre. Although scorecards are completed for NSG it is for information purposes only, there is no competition ladder.

Years 5 & 6 – Junior competition

The Year 5 and 6 teams are graded by an independent netball professional into teams according to the player's abilities. Perth Netball Association (PNA) require that Clubs grade Year 5 and Year 6 teams before being submitted. Once the season starts, PNA will grade each team into the appropriate division. Grading will be on a Thursday in late March straight after school. Details to follow in a later email once registration is closed. Games are played on Saturday mornings at Perth Netball Centre. There are no finals for this competition, the team at the top of the ladder at the end of the competition is considered the winner.

Net Set Go Years 2, 3 and 4 - season commences Friday 3rd May 2024 with the last game of the season being on Friday 16th August 2024.

Game Times

Games will be at the same time each week and take approximately 1 hour.

Team Numbers

As the maximum registered players per team is 10, the Club reserves the right to close registrations for that year group when multiples of 10 are reached. If your registration is received after closure, then your child will be offered the opportunity to play with a different year group if available. If numbers do not provide for a full team in a year group, the Club reserves the right to allocate children into a split year group to enable all children to play netball.

Uniforms

Year 4 to 6 will wear the John XXIII College Netball dress and navy bloomers. The dress and blue bloomers are available at the College Uniform Shop. We recommend you visit the Uniform Shop as soon as possible to purchase or order your dress. This is the same dress that the secondary school netball club player's wear.

Year 2 and 3 will wear the John XXIII Sports Uniform.

Boys wear the JTC sports uniform

Jewellery is not permitted on court. All jewellery must be removed, NOT TAPED. Players wearing jewellery will be asked to leave the court.

Nails must be short and filed smooth.

Coaches

The netball club relies on parent participation. We realise that not everyone has the netball background to coach however if you are keen to coach, please let us know, we can provide support and training programs for all age groups. The coach is responsible for running the weekly training session and coaching the girls on game day. The girls respond well when parents are involved so we would really encourage parents to coach.

PNA offer practical coaching courses.

These will be advertised in the PNA Post newsletter but information can also be found on their website. We recommend booking early as they fill up very quickly.

Managers

A manager is required for each team. For those that prefer an administrative role, this is perfect for you. The main function is to prepare the parent roster for scoring and timing, oranges and captain. We can assist new managers in their role. This is a fun way to be involved in the team.

Training

Teams train once a week. The girls train in their sport uniform.

Net Set Go (Years 2, 3 and 4)

Year 2s train on the Primary oval on grass, outside the year 2 classrooms. 2 courts will be marked. Years 3 & 4 have training on the hard courts near the Year 7 area. Training is approximate 45 – 60minutes and will be arranged by the team coach.

Juniors (Years 5 and 6) train on hard courts near the Year 7 area.

Years 5 & 6 training will be organised by the coach.

Training is a compulsory component of all team sports. It is vital that all players attend training to keep up with learned skills and strategies. Netball is a winter sport therefore games and training are held in the rain. If there is severe weather and your game or training is cancelled you will be notified via your team coach or manager or the Club or School.

Umpires

Umpires are provided by the John XXIII College Netball Club. Each game has 2 umpires – 1 provided by each team. The Club pays the umpires directly.

John XXIII College Netball Club provides a comprehensive netball umpiring program. Umpires assigned to primary school games are generally new to umpiring. We request that parents **please do not approach the umpires during the game**. They have mentors that will offer them guidance throughout the season. 2024 PLAYERS' CODE OF CONDUCT

- Play by the rules.
- Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your captain approach the official during a break or after the competition.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of players or officials, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent is not acceptable or permitted.
- Work equally hard for yourself and your team. Your team's performance will benefit and so will you.
- Be a good sport. Applaud good plays whether they are by your team or the opposition.
- Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another player.
- Co-operate with the umpire, your coach, teammates and opponents. Without them there would be no competition.
- Play for the fun of it, and not just to please parents and coaches.

2024 SPECTATORS' AND PARENTS' CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

- Encourage your child to participate but do not force them.
- Focus upon your child's efforts and performance rather than the overall outcome of the event. This assists your child in setting realistic goals related to his / her ability by reducing the emphasis on winning.
- Teach your child that an honest effort is as important as winning, so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment
- Encourage your child to always play according to the rules.
- Be a model of good sports behaviour for children to copy. Applaud good play by all players.
- Never ridicule or scold a child for making a mistake or losing a game. Positive comments are motivational.
- If you disagree with an umpire or coach raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than question their judgement and honesty in public.
- Refrain from conduct which could be regarded as sexual harassment, discrimination, bullying or victimisation.
- Recognise and respect the value and importance of volunteer administrators, coaches and umpires. They give up their time and resources to provide recreation activities for players and deserve your support.
- Be courteous in communication with administrators, coaches, players and umpires. Teach your child to do the same.
- Support the use of age-appropriate development activities and modified rule.
- Condemn the use of violence in any form, be it by spectators, coaches, officials or players.
- Show respect for your team's opponents. Without them there would be no game.
- Do not use bad language or harass players, coaches or officials.
- Respect rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
